77 Eurydice dances ever closer to the serpent. 81 She is bitten and dies. 82 Deep Sorrow (♩ = c 60)

96 Orpheus resolves to recover Eurydice.

102 Orpheus warily descends to the underworld.

112 The River Styx and the Eerie Underworld

123 Orpheus is rebuked. (♩ = c 92) 132 Orpheus performs. (♩ = c 60) 139 Hades relents, but Orpheus may not look back at Eurydice until they reach sunlight. (♩ = c 92)

146 Orpheus departs, followed by Eurydice. (Andante, ma poco a poco accel.)

Orpheus grows uncertain that Eurydice follows.

159 Orpheus glances back. Eurydice vanishes. 161 Profound Despondency (♩ = c 80)

163 Orpheus wanders aimlessly.

**4** *mp* *mp*

*Repeat until the conductor gives the signal to stop.*
